Liu Ts'un-yan and Liu Chiang Szu-yung Scholarships for Honours in Traditional Chinese Studies

Conditions of Award

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Each year, the ANU College of Asia and The Pacific ("The College") will have a scholarship for award known as the Liu Ts'un-yan and Liu Chiang Szu-yung Scholarships for Honours in Traditional Chinese Studies ("the Scholarship").

2. VALUE

- 2.1 The Scholarship is valued at an amount of \$9000, paid in two equal instalments to be processed following the Census Date of each semester.
- 2.2 The Scholarship does not provide exemption from payment under the Commonwealth Supported Students HECS-HELP Scheme.

3. ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 The Scholarship shall be available for award each year to a student who;
- (a.) is successful in gaining entry into the Honours year of an undergraduate program offered by the ANU College of Asia and the Pacific,
- (b.) will undertake research on a suitable topic in Traditional Chinese Studies.
- (c.) has evidence of advanced proficiency in modern and classical Chinese language, evidence of advanced proficiency in modern and classical Chinese equivalent to completion of the College's Chinese language major. In exceptional circumstances, the language requirement may be waived for students with an outstanding university track record (Distinction or above) in a discipline such as history, philosophy, literature, classics or art and a demonstrated strong interest in Traditional/Classical Studies.
- 3.2 Strong preference will be given to candidates with evidence of advanced proficiency in Modern and Literary Chinese language and who will use Literary Chinese language sources in their research.
- 3.3 The Scholarship is open to Domestic students.

4. APPLICATION

4.1 No formal application is required, eligible commencing students will automatically be considered for the scholarship.

5. SELECTION

- 5.1 The Scholarship shall be offered by the Dean of the College (or nominee).
- 5.2 The candidates are selected for the Scholarship based on academic merit, thesis proposal, the letter from the potential supervisor, and, where appropriate, language proficiency
- 5.3 In any year, a Scholarship shall not be offered when, in the opinion of the Dean of the College (or nominee), there is no applicant of sufficient merit.



6. CONCURRENT HOLDING OF SCHOLARSHIPS

- 6.1 The scholar must obtain approval from the Dean of the College (or nominee), to hold any other type of scholarships and awards concurrently with the Scholarship.
- 6.2 Failure to declare and obtain permission to hold another award or scholarship may result in the scholar being required to refund the Scholarship to the College, as determined by the Dean of the College (or nominee).

7. ENROLMENT

7.1 The scholar shall enrol and remain enrolled on a full-time basis at this University in either the Honours Year of a program of study leading to the award of the degree of Bachelor with Honours or in the final year of a program of study leading to the award of the degree of Bachelor with Honours where the honours component is an integral part of the final year.

8. COMMENCEMENT

- 8.1 The Scholarship commencement date shall be outlined in the formal letter of offer.
- 8.2 The Scholarship will be deemed to have commenced for the semester identified in the letter of offer.
- 8.3 The Scholarship may not be deferred.

9. TENURE

9.1 The Scholarships is for one year, payable from the semester the Scholarship commences and subject to satisfactory academic progress and continued enrolment in the honours program within the College.

10. TERMINATION

- 10.1 The scholarship may be terminated where a successful applicant:
- (a) fails to enrol for the Honours Year of a program of study leading to the award of the degree of bachelor with Honours within one year;
- (b) changes to part-time enrolment without permission of the College;
- (c) withdraws from the program before completing the year;
- (d) has not, in the opinion of the College, performed at a satisfactory academic level in the first semester of the Honours Program.
- 10.2 Should the Scholarship be terminated, the College shall determine if any or all the scholarship monies should be repaid.

11. PUBLICITY

- 11.1 It is anticipated that the Scholar may be requested to participate in publicity of the Scholarship from time to time. This may include but not limited to;
- (a) publicity in the state of territory of residence or of schooling
- (b) an interview, a photograph,
- 11.2 The College may also request written responses from the Scholar which can include but not limited to;
- (a) a summary of basic profile
- (b) description of University experiences
- (c) a note of appreciation for the Donor who has funded their Scholarship.
