



VIS AND ANJELI NATHAN TRAVEL GRANT (ANTHROPOLOGY)

CONDITIONS OF AWARD

1. INTRODUCTION

Each year the ANU College of Arts and Social Sciences (“the College”) may offer a travel grant known as the Vis and Anjeli Nathan Travel Grants (Anthropology) (“the award”).

The objective of the award is to provide support to facilitate travel or fieldwork to a student who is enrolled in a full time capacity in an undergraduate Anthropology program and has demonstrated a high capacity for achievement in that field of study.

Funding for this award has been provided by the Vis and Anjeli Nathan Scholarship . The Scholarship was established in 2001 by the parents of Anjeli Nathan to honour her memory following her death in a car accident the previous year while conducting fieldwork in South Africa. Anjeli Nathan was a university medallist in Zoology in 1998 after completing an honours degree at the School of Botany and Zoology in the ANU College of Science.

2. BENEFITS

The value of the Travel Grant is stated in your letter of offer. The award is paid in one instalment prior to the commencement of their fieldwork unless otherwise stated in the letter of offer.

The recipient is responsible for making payment of all tuition fees by the prescribed date as set out by the University each session. Recipients of this award are responsible for the costs of books, study materials, accommodation and all other costs of study.

3. ELIGIBILITY

The award is available each year to an ANU student who:

- (a) Is a domestic or international student.
- (b) Has demonstrated a high capacity for achievement in the field of Anthropology.
- (c) Is enrolled in an undergraduate program offered by the ANU College of Arts and Social sciences in the field of Anthropology.

4. APPLICATION

The application is submitted on the prescribed form. Any requirement for supporting documentation and forwarding details will be stated on the application form and/or ANU Scholarships website. The application and all supporting documentation (where applicable) must be submitted on, or prior to, the closing date published on the ANU scholarships website.

5. SELECTION

Selection is made on the basis of academic merit and application.

The award is offered to a student by a selection committee chaired by the Head of Anthropology, CASS School of Archaeology & Anthropology. The selection committee will also include the Field school Course Convenor and a Field school Convenor from another Discipline.

The selection committee reserves the right to make no award if it considers there is no applicant of sufficient merit. The selection committee may also vary the number of awards and/or offer the award at other times in exceptional circumstances or based on the standard of applications or students (where funds allow).

6. CONCURRENT HOLDING OF AWARDS

A recipient of the Vis and Anjeli Nathan Travel Grant is permitted to concurrently hold other scholarships, awards, grants and bursaries.

7. DEFERMENT

The award cannot be deferred.

8. CESSATION OF AWARD

The award ceases or should be surrendered:

- (a) At the conclusion of the semester for which the award is allocated; or
- (b) On the date on which the recipient withdraws or ceases to attend the University other than for approved absences;
- (d) If a recipient transfers out of the Anthropology field prior to commencing field school/fieldwork;
- (e) If a recipient breaches academic or behavioural standards set by the University under the Academic Misconduct & Discipline Rules or breaks the law in the country in which they are undertaking fieldwork.

9. REPAYMENT OF FUNDS

If a recipient breaches conditions of award, subject to the information available at the time, the Dean of the College may request that the payment be refunded in part or in full.

10. PROVIDING FALSE OR MISLEADING INFORMATION

The awarding of a grant is based on the information provided to the University. An award may be withdrawn at any stage if incorrect, false or misleading information is provided or relevant information is withheld. This includes circumstances where the false information is unrelated to the assessment in awarding the grant.

11. VARIATION TO CONDITIONS OF AWARD

In exceptional circumstances and on a case-by-case basis section 7 of these conditions of award may be varied by the Dean on the recommendation of the Chair of Selection Committee.

12. TAXATION & CENTRELINK

Recipients are responsible for seeking taxation and Centrelink advice regarding their own individual circumstances. Scholarships/grants may be regarded as taxable income if a recipient is enrolled on a part-time basis.

13. PUBLICITY

The recipient may be requested to participate in publicity for the award from time to time. This may include publicity in the state or territory of residence or of schooling. Recipients may be contacted for an interview and photograph. The University may also publicise the award by publishing the names of the recipients. Arrangements for such publicity will be made through the ANU College of Arts and Social Sciences or Strategic Communications and Public Affairs Office of the University.
