

OLIN J EGGEN RESEARCH AWARD CONDITIONS OF AWARD

1. INTRODUCTION

Each year the Research School of Astronomy & Astrophysics ('the School') in the ANU College of Science ('the College') may offer up to three awards known as the Olin J Eggen Research Award ('the Award').

Funding for this Award has been made possible due to an endowment set up to commemorate the contributions of the late Professor Olin J Eggen. Professor Eggen, a native of Wisconsin, USA, was the Director of Mt Stromlo Observatory from 1966 to 1977, a period that saw considerable growth, and with it the foundation of the high international regard in which the Research School of Astronomy & Astrophysics is held.

The objective of the Award is to support outstanding international students to enable them to pursue a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) program in Astronomy & Astrophysics based in the Research School of Astronomy & Astrophysics.

2. BENEFITS

The value of the Award is AUD\$2.500.

Payment: The Award payment will be made to the student upon commencement in the PhD program, or, at a time requested by the student, no later than 12 months from the date of commencement.

3. ELIGIBILITY

The Award is available each year to a prospective international student who:

- is enrolling full-time in a program of study for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Astronomy & Astrophysics based in the Research School of Astronomy & Astrophysics and
- (b) has a demonstrated track record of significant research that contributes to the field of Astronomy & Astrophysics.

Enrolment in the PhD program must be undertaken in the year the Award is granted.

4. SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

No application for the Award is required. Eligible students applying for admission to the PhD program will be automatically considered.

5. SELECTION

Selection is made based on:

- (a) academic merit and research potential, academic record;
- (b) research achievements and accomplishments (e.g., submitted or published refereed

papers, conference presentations); and

(c) impact, or potential for impact, in the relevant research field.

The Award will be awarded following ranking determined by the RSAA Scholarship Committee on the recommendation of the Delegate Authority appointed by the Director of the Research School of Astronomy and Astrophysics.

The Award shall not be awarded if, in the opinion of the Delegate Authority, there are no candidates of sufficient merit. The School reserves the right to make no awards in a given year, to vary the number of awards or to make an award/s at other times in exceptional circumstances as determined by the Director of the Research School of Astronomy and Astrophysics (or nominee). The School reserves the right to revise the award, criteria and conditions from time to time.

6. DEFERMENT

The Award cannot be deferred.

7. TERMINATION OF AWARD

The Award ceases or should be surrendered:

- (a) if a student no longer meets the eligibility requirements;
- (b) on the date on which the recipient withdraws or ceases to attend the University other than for approved absences;
- (c) if a recipient fails to enrol as required in section 3;
- (d) if a recipient changes their program or course without permission to retain the Award;
- (e) if a recipient breaches academic or behavioural standards set by the University under the Discipline Rule (2021) and Academic Integrity Rule (2021).

whichever is earliest. Should the Award be terminated, the Director, or delegate, shall determine if any or all monies should be repaid.

8. PROVIDING FALSE OR MISLEADING INFORMATION

The Award is based on the information provided to the University. The Award may be withdrawn at any stage if incorrect, false or misleading information is provided or relevant information is withheld. This includes circumstances where the false information is unrelated to the assessment for the Award.

9. VARIATION TO CONDITIONS OF AWARD

In exceptional circumstances and on a case-by-case basis, these Conditions of Award may be varied by the Pro Vice-Chancellor (Graduate Research) on the recommendation of the Delegate Authority.

10. TAXATION & CENTRELINK

Recipients are responsible for seeking taxation and Centrelink advice (if applicable) regarding their own individual circumstances. Awards may be regarded as taxable income if a recipient is enrolled on a part-time basis.

Recipients will also be required to acknowledge funding from the Award should the outcomes lead to publication.

For the purposes of reporting on the impact of awards, the name, program name and demographics (for example: age, country or town of residence) relating to a recipient of the Award may be disclosed to donors supporting the Award. This will not include recipient contact details. The recipient may be asked to write a personal note of thanks or to meet with donors. Any contact between a donor and a recipient will be facilitated by the ANU Advancement Office or an authorised representative of the University.
