BACHELOR OF MATHEMATICAL SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP

CONDITIONS OF AWARD

1. INTRODUCTION

The Australian National University (ANU) ('the University') may offer a number of awards known as the Bachelor of Mathematical Sciences Scholarship ('the Award').

The objective of the Award is to support students undertaking the Bachelor of Mathematical Sciences program through to Honours by reducing financial barriers to study and strengthening educational outcomes for students experiencing financial hardship, including those from regional and remote communities.

Funding for this Award is provided by the Mathematical Sciences Institute.

2. BENEFITS

The value of the Award is stated in the letter of offer. The duration of the Award is for up to three years, with recipients eligible for a fourth year of support if they progress directly to the Mathematics Honours program.

The Award is paid in equal instalments after census date each semester unless otherwise stated in the letter of offer.

The student is responsible for payment of all tuition fees by the prescribed date as set out by the University each session. All costs for books, study materials, accommodation, and other study-related expenses are the responsibility of the student.

3. ELIGIBILITY

The Award is available to a commencing ANU student who:

- (a) is a domestic student; and
- (b) receives an offer of admission to the Bachelor of Mathematical Sciences, either as a single degree or as part of a flexible double degree program.

4. APPLICATION

All applicants applying for admission through the ANU Admission Scholarship and Accommodation Application System will be automatically considered for the Award based on meeting the eligibility criteria and electing to be considered for scholarships.

5. SELECTION

Only applicants who meet all the eligibility criteria will be considered. Selection is made based on demonstrated financial hardship.

Where there are more equally ranked applicants than Awards available, preference may be given in order of priority, to applicants who, at the time of application:

- i. demonstrate the greatest level of financial hardship, as evidenced by approved adjustment factors relating to that hardship;
- ii. reside in a Very Remote, Remote or Outer Regional area, as determined by the [Australian Statistical Geography Standard \(ASGS\)](#); preference will be given in the following order:

- Very Remote
 - Remote
 - Outer Regional
 - Inner Regional
- iii. have the highest number of approved adjustment factors; and
 - iv. have the highest ANU Selection Rank.

The Award is offered to a student by the University Coursework Scholarships Committee, as established under the ANU Coursework Scholarships procedure.

The Selection Committee reserves the right to make no award where it considers there is no applicant of sufficient merit. The Selection Committee may also vary the number of awards offered and/or offer the award at alternative times in exceptional circumstances or based on the quality of the applicant pool, where funds allow.

6. CONCURRENT HOLDING OF AWARDS

A recipient of the Award is permitted to hold concurrent student financial awards as outlined in the ANU Scholarships, grants and bursaries (coursework) procedure.

7. DEFERMENT

The Award cannot be deferred.

8. ONGOING ELIGIBILITY

Enrolment in 24 units per study period is required to remain eligible for this Award.

Written permission must be obtained from the Director of the Mathematical Sciences Institute or their approved nominee to hold the Award on a part-time basis. If approved, payments will be made on a pro-rata basis.

A Grade Point Average (GPA) of 5.5 or above must be maintained each semester, calculated across all courses undertaken in that semester (including sessions overlapping that semester).

If the required GPA is not met in any semester, a formal warning will be issued.

If the recipient does not meet the required GPA in a subsequent semester, the Award may be suspended or terminated.

Before suspension or cessation, an opportunity will be provided to outline performance concerns and proposed remediation steps.

9. CESSATION OF AWARD

The Award ceases or should be surrendered:

- (a) if a recipient no longer meets the eligibility requirements;
- (b) at the conclusion of the period outlined in section 2;
- (c) on the date on which the recipient withdraws or ceases to attend the University other than for approved absences;
- (d) if a recipient fails to enrol as required in section 8;
- (e) if a recipient changes to part-time enrolment without receiving permission to retain the Award;
- (f) if a recipient changes the program or course without permission to retain the Award;
- (g) if a recipient fails to meet the minimum academic performance requirements; or
- (h) if a recipient breaches academic or behavioural standards set by the University under the Student academic integrity Policy and/or the Discipline Rule;

- (i) if it is identified that the recipient has breached the financial cap for student financial awards (including scholarships, grants, and bursaries), as outlined in the [University's Student financial awards policy](#);

whichever is earliest.

10. REPAYMENT OF FUNDS

Subject to the information available at the time, the Director of the Mathematical Sciences Institute or their approved nominee may request that the payment for the study period in which the breach of conditions or withdrawal occurs be refunded in part or in full.

11. PROVIDING FALSE OR MISLEADING INFORMATION

Selection for the Award is based on the information provided to the University. The Award may be withdrawn at any stage if incorrect, false or misleading information is provided or relevant information is withheld. This includes circumstances where the false information is unrelated to the assessment for the Award.

12. VARIATION TO CONDITIONS OF AWARD

In exceptional circumstances and on a case-by-case basis, section 7, of these Conditions of Award may be varied by the Dean of ANU College of Systems and Society on the recommendation of the Director, Mathematical Sciences Institute or their approved nominee.

13. TAXATION

Students are responsible for seeking independent taxation advice regarding individual circumstances. Students receiving Centrelink benefits should be aware that student financial awards may affect Centrelink payments. Student financial awards are generally regarded as taxable income if a student is enrolled on a part-time basis.

Recipients may be contacted for an interview and photograph. The University may also publicise the Award by publishing the names of the recipients. Arrangements for such publicity will be made through the appropriate University communications channels, in consultation with relevant ANU communications and marketing teams.

16. DISCLOSURE AND DONOR CONTACT

To report on the impact of student financial awards, the recipient's name, program of study, and broad demographic information (for example: age, country or town of residence) may be disclosed to donors supporting the Award. This will not include recipient contact details. The recipient may be asked to write a personal note of thanks or to meet with donors. Any contact between a donor and a recipient will be facilitated by the ANU Advancement Office or an authorised representative of the University.
